Nonumion members, represented by the exclusive representatives which are legally responsible for the representation, bargaining and governance, shall be required to pay fair share fees to the representatives, and the representatives shall have the right to negotiate the fair share fees. The faix share fees shall be used to defray the costs incurred by the representatives in fulfilling their duties to represent the nonunion members in their employment relations.

> 'In cases in which an exclusive representative represents a nonmember employee, such employee shall be required to pay such representative a reasonable fee as determined by the Authority.'.

APWU national leadership has been skeptical about the chances of a bill like this getting passed, given the current political climate. But if you think about it, this is the kind of measure Republicans should LOVE: it's about paying your way and not getting something for nothing. No other bargaining unit employees in the country receive the kind of free ride nonunion members in the Postal Service have been enjoying."Note: APWU national leadership has stated that if this bill is introduced, they will do their best to secure its passage.
